From the Rector

In the Diocese of Georgia it is normative for all clergy to participate in four leadership development programs. Each clergy person is in a formal coaching relationship. Certified coaches work with the clergy person on examining and putting into practice how to get from "here" to "there" in his/her ministry, thus improving individual effectiveness. The Emotional Intelligence-Human Relations workshop focuses on identifying and practicing inter-personal and intra-group skills. Another part of the Lay and Clergy Leadership Development initiative of the Diocese of Georgia is the Church Development Institute. This two-year program assists church leaders to develop the skills already possessed and stretch them into areas and in ways which will benefit the communities they serve. This past week at Honey Creek, your Rector participated in the Conflict Management workshop which is part of the comprehensive leadership development initiative of our diocese.

We are now encouraged to consider health of a church instead of average Sunday attendance as a more accurate metric of success and effectiveness. Areas of church health include: relationships, communication, decision making and conflict management. While the last of these was the focus for this particular week, we did not lose sight of others. In addition to a complex arrangement of church expectations, processes, and practices, church health is in large part determined by how well people are included, exercise influence and grow in openness and affection for one another. This past week I learned more about myself and about the community of faith with which I have been gifted. I learned about structures we called "green lines".
